National Preparedness Month 2017

The focus of National Preparedness Month (NPM) this year is on different ways of planning for an emergency. The overarching theme is "Disasters Don't Plan Ahead. You Can." Ready.gov's goal is to increase the number of individuals, families and communities engaging in preparedness actions whether at home, work, business, school, or house of worship.

The Ready.gov website has many resources available for people who want to promote National Preparedness on social media, graphics, videos, and



power point presentations. The Ready.gov website clearly states that you can edit these materials to your needs and the needs of your audience, as long as you include that Ready.gov as the source of the information.

There are weekly themes throughout September and each one has tailored social media messages and other resources. The four weekly themes for 2017 are:

Week 1: September 1-9 Make a Plan for Yourself, Family and Friends

- The emphasis this week is to communicate, plan, and practice an emergency plan.
- Sign up for emergency alerts at Fairfax Alerts: http://www.fairfax-county.gov/alerts/.
- Know whether to shelter in place or where to go if evacuation is ordered.
- Know the types of disasters that are frequent in your area.
- Check out plans for families, for pet owners, and for commuters.
 There is also an eemergency financial preparation kit.
- For sample plans, click on Make an Emergency Plan. Be sure to check out the video.

Week 2: September 10-16 Plan to Help Your Neighbor and Community

- In week 2, the emphasis is on making sure people can provide vital assistance in a disaster before emergency personnel arrive.
- Encourage neighbors and friends to sign up for the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)! Go to www.fairfaxcountycert.org.
- Would you consider giving a presentation to your community group or house of worship? There is a web-based training and instructor's guide. Click here to take the "You Are the Help Until Help Arrives" web-based training. If you go through the slides, you'll see that there are links to videos that highlight what is being discussed. There is a tremendous amount of information here.

Week 3: September 17-23 Practice and Build Out Your Plans

- The focus this week is to complete an Emergency Financial
 First Aid Kit (EFFAK), maintain emergency savings for use in
 case of an emergency; participate in an emergency drill; and
 know how to access community resources (e.g., shelters, food
 banks).
- Plan ahead for paying bills during an emergency, make digital copies of important documents, have at least one week's medications for every family member.
- Plan now for floods, as they are the disaster we see most in this area. Flood insurance policies don't go into effect for 30 days after an emergency. See www.floodsmart.gov so that you are prepared.

Week 4: September 24-30 Get Involved! Be a Part of Something Larger

- Get your campus, business, faith-based organization and community organization prepared for an emergency. 40% of businesses do not recover from a disaster. Developing a plan lessens the impact of a disaster on a business. By planning in advance, resiliency after the disaster is improved.
- Make sure your campus is prepared: www.ready.gov/campus. See that your school has emergency plans in place. Know how to contact your family and friends if phone lines are down. Text instead of call and use social media to let friends and family know that you are safe.

Ask A Pro or Someone in the Know

Q: How do I find out about classes and activities?

A: There are three easy ways to find out what is going on:

Q: How do I take a FEMA class online?

A: Follow these easy steps:

- You will need to get a FEMA SID (student ID) if this is your first course or you haven't taken one since 2014. Go to https://cdp.dhs.gov/femasid to register for an ID or look yours up if you've forgotten it.
- 2. Courses are found at https://training.fema.gov/is/ or follow individual links below. There is no fee to take the courses.

3. Take the course online and complete the final exam. You will usually get an email with your results the next day.

Girl Scouts' Emergency Preparedness Workshop

On Sunday, August 13, a group of 15 local Girl Scouts gathered at the Fire and Rescue Academy for a CERT-conducted Emergency Preparedness Workshop. The day started with the girls listing their goals for the day as well as their reasons for attending. Responses included that it would be good to learn what to do, how to become more resourceful, how to help others, and how to better react in emergencies.

The girls were split into three teams and asked to list possible disasters. They were then instructed to pick a team name from the list. Morning round robin sessions covered saving lives with duct tape, what is in your emergency kit, and a tour of the Academy. After lunch the girls saw a presentation of fire prevention and then were able to practice what they had learned.

The final activity before the closing was a rodeo where they were able to use what they had learned. One of the stations required them to use their namesake disaster (Gas leak, Hurricane, Fire and Terrorism) to finish a story that began, "It was a dark and stormy night at the Academy." Each member of the team was to add three lines to the story.

When the stories were performed at the closing, the entire staff was surprised at the creativity and enthusiasm of teams, their enterprising use of materials, and the incredible amount of energy that these young ladies displayed at the end of this busy day.

"Designing the workshop for this age group to encourage the preparedness mind-set falls in line with the strategic objectives of our program," said Anita Van der Merwe, Fairfax County CERT Deputy Lead.

At the conclusion of the exercise, the Scout who said that she wanted to be able to better react to an emergency agreed that not only was she better able to react, but also able to prepare. The Scout who organized this project said she did so when she realized that she wasn't as prepared as she would like to be and wanted to learn more and help other Girl Scouts do the same. Overall, she was happy with what they had learned and she is anxious to be old enough to attend a CERT class.

A great day for all; and there are now 15 new duct tape enthusiasts!
